THE WEAKNESS OF THE GREAT WALL

In ancient China, the people desired security from the barbaric, invading hordes to the north. To get this protection, they built the Great Wall of China. It's 10 metres high, 6 metres thick and almost 3,000km long.

Despite this seemingly impenetrable defence, during the first 100 years of its existence, China was successfully invaded three times.

It wasn't the wall's fault. During all three invasions, the barbarians never climbed over the wall, broke it down or went around it; they simply bribed a gatekeeper and then marched right in through an open door. The purpose of the wall failed because of a breakdown of integrity.

- We have a responsibility to help children build walls to protect their lives from attack.
- Christian values, like integrity and respect, need to be taught and modelled as well.
- The gospel also provides forgiveness for the times when we do fail and also the power to help people to actually be able to do what is right.

Our approach to children's ministry must be complete; ministering to the body, the soul and the spiritual.

GUESSTIMATE:



Equipment:

- Glass jar or clear container
- Jelly beans, or other lollies

Instructions:

Before the program, the leader counts the number of sweets in the jar and writes the answer on a piece of paper which is then put out of sight. To play the game, get the


children to guess the total number of sweets in the jar and to write it down on a piece of paper along with their name. The leader then displays the correct answer. The player who guesses closest to the correct number is the winner. The winner has to share (say) two sweets each with the other players and then gets to keep the rest of the goodies to take home. Why not be creative and use items that are healthy instead!

\$20 NOTE

Theme: Our value comes from who we are, not what we can do.



"Who can tell me how many dollars this \$20 note is worth?"

"Is this note worth \$20 because it's good at sport?" "Is this note worth \$20 because it's good at its school work?"

"Is this note worth \$20 because it's good at playing a musical instrument?"

"No matter what this \$20 can or can't do, it is still worth \$20. This \$20 note is valuable, not because of what it can do, but because of what it is."

"People are worth far more than \$20. In fact people are worth more than money. We are made in God's likeness, by God and for God. We are valuable and precious to him. When God made the sun, moon, stars & animals he said,, 'That's good.' However, when he made people he said, 'that's <u>VERY</u> good.'"

"Let's just check out to see how good this \$20 note is at sport."

Fold the note so that it will stand by itself on its edge on a table. Instruct it to run from the table to the side of the room and back again. "Was the \$20 note able to run fast? Is it still worth \$20?"

Instruct (humorously) the \$20 note to jump in the air. "Could it jump high? But it's still a year though it's no good at sport"

Take the note and scrunch it in your hand. Then pretend to stamp your foot on it.

"Is the \$20 note still valuable? No matter what I do to it, it is still worth \$20. There are times in my life when I feel all scrunched up. I feel hurt by others or useless, but I'm still valuable."
